PARK HAPPENINGS



COLLECTIONS & EXHIBITS

The Hastings City Bank clock was removed from

the historic village on October 4. The Charlton Park Village Foundation provided the initial funds to get the restoration project off and running. The restorer, Robert Butts, with assistance from A n' D Signs, removed the clock from the pedestal and transported it to his shop in northern Michigan. The clock will be



returned in full splendor and working order in the spring of 2014.

The collections department has been busy over the last couple of months wrapping up projects and starting new ones! Rebecca Kyes and Judy Mudge are continuing in the ethnographic and archive collections respectively. Mary Brinks is plugging her way through the Farmhouse Barn inventory and Dylan Tilbury has started the Sixberry House inventory. Roberta Meeker and Sharon Zebrowski are choosing artifacts for a new Irving D. Charlton Display.

In 2014, the Park will host Dinosaur Prep Lab, with bone cleaning demonstrations and real Edmontosaurus bones. Dinosaur Prep Lab is a traveling exhibit that will be on display at the Park April 7 – June 27, 2014. The exhibit will be free to the public during normal business operation and for no additional cost during ticketed special events. PaleoJoe will be on site to clean actual dinosaur bones and talk with the public on April 19, May 3, and June 7, 2014. Paleo-Joe is the author of several children's books and the Park has developed a reading program in conjunction with ALL of the Barry County libraries to complement the exhibit. PaleoJoe will also be presenting at Barry County libraries throughout the exhibit's run. We are excited to offer our visitors and the residents of Barry County the opportunity to explore the world of dinosaurs.

OPERATIONS UPDATE

The maintenance staff has been winterizing the recreation area and clearing the fields in High Mead-

ows. Cutting down dead ash trees, planting new trees, and assisting with the set up and tear down for events has occupied their time as well. Painting of the interior and exterior of the Barber Shop was completed, and the building



received new gutters! Thanks also for starting fires in the woodstoves every morning for the education programs.
