The *Hats!* display and the Civil War exhibit will both be taken down this winter in preparation for new displays throughout the building. After at least 12 years, the Civil War artifacts are being returned to storage to make way for a exhibit on home life at the turn of the 20th century. He reenlisted in the 6th Michigan Cavalry in late 1862 and we have continued his story by publishing his letters and diary entries on the day he wrote them 150 years later.
