PARK HAPPENINGS

DIRECTOR'S SPOT

Strategic Planning and Master Planning at Historic Charlton Park

Dear Friends,

Wow, Spring has finally arrived! With the warmer temperatures and newness in the air, all of us here at Charlton Park are super excited about the coming summer season. Additionally, we are excited about a couple of processes we have going right now.

Since mid-February our staff and board have been working on developing a Strategic Plan and updating the 5-year parks master plan. Both of these processes will eventually help guide what we do into the future on a short-term and long-term basis. While this may seem to be a duplicate process, ultimately they are both equally important individually.

The strategic plan will focus on categories and visioning for our future. With a process that focuses on the Collections, Village, Museum, Recreation Area, and Administration, it will truly be all encompassing. The end product of strategic planning should help give us guidance for better governance of our resources and sustainability for enjoyment by future generations.

The master plan is primarily focused on the parks and recreational component of Historic Charlton Park. This particular planning process is required to be done every five years, to ensure our eligibility for grants and other funding mechanisms. Focusing on our environment based activities like swimming, trails & hiking, boating, and things that get people into the out-of-doors. Ultimately, the master plan will provide us guidance on future expansion, development, or renovation and improvements within our recreation area, and on the undeveloped portion of Charlton Park.

Like all things, both of these processes are only as good as the information and feedback that is given by those who are willing to give of their time or experiences. We will be conducting surveys, holding public input sessions, and soliciting information many times this year.

On May 16, 2013, at 6:30 p.m. we will be conducting a joint meeting at the Barry-Eaton District Health Department to solicit input for the Master Plan. This meeting will be focusing on parks and outdoor recreational activities at Charlton Park and those managed by the Parks Board throughout Barry County. I would encourage all to attend that have an interest in Parks and Recreation.

Beginning the last week of May, Charlton Park will begin a survey sampling to get feedback for further developing our strategic plan. This survey will be focusing on all aspects of Charlton Park operations and on what visitors want, why they came, and where they are from. Surveys will be available on-line, on-site, and through mailings if requested.

Further into the summer we will be conducting additional public input meetings seeking information for both our strategic plan and master plan, so keep us on your radar. We are eager to get your thoughts about anything and everything regarding our future, so please get involved and help support our process, as we begin to shape our future for years to come.
