The Michigan Paranormal Research Society investigated several buildings in the historic village overnight on May 20th. You may have noticed some bright green and purple boxes up in the recreation area recently. Those boxes were mounted by the U.S. Forest Service and Michigan State University to detect and study the Emerald Ash Borer. Historic Charlton Park has

a grove of ash trees in the recreation area. The boxes you see are sticky traps. Scientists know that the Emerald Ash Borer is attracted to the color purple and to the smell of ash trees and the bugs are removed from the sticky traps and counted each week.
