FOUNDATION UPDATE

The Charlton Park Village Foundation launched its 2016-17 Annual Giving Campaign on November 18, with a year-end fundraising mailing sent to 275 households. The Foundation was established in 1988 with the mission to provide funds to maintain the Park's historic collection, artifacts and buildings. Recognizing that financial assistance is needed to supplement the taxpayer supported .2259 mils used to currently operate the Park, the Foundation created an endowment fund to supplement Park improvements.

The interest from the fund supports annual projects and is used to repair and maintain our eighteen historic buildings which highlight our local heritage and are a unique source of community pride for more than 30,000 visitors annually.
